


Maps for Globe at Night latitude  $-50^\circ$ , March 17, 21 h local time (Sun at  $-25^\circ$ ), turbid air. Lines from N(E,S,W) to zenith shown (crosses each  $10^\circ$ ). Regulus ( $\alpha$  Leonis) is  $23^\circ$  to the right from N, at  $25^\circ$  height. Detailed maps  $50^\circ$  vertically, the first four maps  $100^\circ$ . *Jan Hollan, CzechGlobe*



Maps for Globe at Night latitude  $-50^\circ$ , April 15, 21 h local time (Sun at  $-36^\circ$ ), turbid air. Lines from N(E,S,W) to zenith shown (crosses each  $10^\circ$ ). Regulus ( $\alpha$  Leonis) is  $8^\circ$  to the left from N, at  $28^\circ$  height. Mars, close to it, is much brighter. Detailed maps  $50^\circ$  vertically, the first four maps  $100^\circ$ . *Jan Hollan, CzechGlobe*
